



PUPPY PREPARATION CHECKLIST

What you will need to pickup the puppy at the airport:

- Towel to wrap the puppy in
- Wet wipes to clean puppy
- Fresh water for the puppy to drink

What you will need at home to prepare for the puppy's arrival:

- Designated area for the dog kennel. It's important to think about this place and decide for sure, because dogs like consistency. It will not be a good thing for them to change a spot after they're used to one. They are creatures of habit.
- Puppy Food. We use the brand: Nulo MedalSeries, Grain-Free Puppy & Adult Salmon Recipe (Limited Ingredient Diet), and they love it... If you wish to use the same we brand do, you can get it at your local big chain pet supply stores.
- Couple chewy toys and/or balls
- Schedule an appointment with a vet in advance for a checkup within 1-2 days after puppy's arrival
- Pre-order NuVet Supplement Wafers for the puppy (Code: 15388) or any immune boosting supplement you trust.
- Optional: a soft bed for the puppy to rest outside the crate
- Optional: a couple of different soft, one-bite training snacks for variety

We provide the following with the puppy:

- Kennel (only with air travel)
- Leash
- Collar/Harness
- Health Certificate
- Ziploc Bag of puppy food
- Food/Water Bowl
- Vaccine record
- When we ship the puppy, we use what looks like a "used" blanket underneath the puppy. We do this not because we're cheap and can't buy a new one, but because the puppy is used to the "smell" of that blanket, and they need something familiar during travel to calm them down since it's a stressful trip for them.

Feeding and potty instructions:

While the pups are with us, they eat three times a day. Usually about 7am, 12pm, and 5pm. Give your puppy food per weight instructions on the food bag (to start about 1/3 cup per feeding) and allow it to eat for 15-20 minutes. Then take the puppy out where you want it to potty. If he finishes his food, great. If he doesn't, it's okay to just take it away. This teaches them discipline and makes your life easier.

Break up the supplement wafers into small pieces and mix in with the food once a day.

You don't want your pup nibbling on food all day, or else you will have a hard time potty-training him since you won't know when to expect him to potty and there will be more frequent accidents you can't control.
